Does this draft make it sufficiently clear when the actuary should issue an actuarial report disclosing methods, procedures, assumptions, and data as opposed to issuing another form of actuarial communication that does not make these disclosures?

I am still not sure when an actuary would issue another form of communication that does not make the disclosures described for an actuarial report.
