4.2.h.	Add a closing statement affirming that <i>“nothing prevents the actuary from disclosing their beliefs as to the reasonableness of the methods or assumptions.”</i>	While we must comply with laws, having leeway to opine on the reasonableness with the disclosures allows for professional prudence.
4.1 & 4.2	Add <i>“Consideration should be given to the actuarial knowledge level and role of the intended user with respect to the level of detail and method of communication.”</i>	The current draft required level of disclosure seems to create a greater duty to provide information beyond what some intended users would need. E.g. entities or work environments where actuaries communicating to internal parties to the organization, often to non-actuaries.
